Grab a Cup of Egg Coffee at Giang Cafe

It's your morning cuppa, done the Northern Vietnamese way — freshly-brewed and blended with egg yolk, condensed milk, butter, and cheese. There's no better place to try one than at the cafe which created this iconic drink.

Opening hours: 7AM – 10:30PM




Stroll Around Hanoi's Old Quarter

There's so much to do in this historic district, from street food to souvenir-shopping, and of course, trying to cross the chaotic streets!

Enjoy Icy Treats At Minci Chè Xoài

Cool down with refreshing desserts at this local store. There's no English menu, but you can't go wrong with bestsellers like the che xoai tran chau (mango pudding with sago), caramen tra xanh thach (matcha caramel flan), and kem trai dua (coconut ice cream).

Today, visit the Ho Chi Minh Mausoleum,
Temple Of Literature, and
St. Joseph's Cathedral — three of
Hanoi's most iconic attractions.

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Visit Vietnam's Revolutionary Leader at the Ho Chi Minh Mausoleum

This grand building houses the embalmed body of Vietnam's beloved leader, Ho Chi Minh. Visiting hours are only in the morning so try to arrive early.

Entrance fee: Free

Opening hours: Varies; closed on Mon and Fri



Have Steamed Rice Rolls at Banh Cuon Nong Ho Tay

These light, chewy dumplings are stuffed with meat and mushrooms, and served with chilli, lime, fish sauce and parsley.

Cost: ~30,000<u>đ</u>

Opening hours: 7AM – 2PM



Fill up on Meat Dumplings at Bánh Giò Miss Béo

For a more hearty meal, try these triangle-shaped rice dumplings. They're bursting with seasoned mince meat, and topped with cucumbers and sausages.

Entrance fee: ~27,000₫


Opening hours: 6AM – 8:30PM



Built way back in 1076, the Temple of Literature was Vietnam's first university, and is now a popular place to pray for good grades. Even if you're no longer studying, you'll enjoy the magnificent architecture and beautiful courtyards.

Entrance fee: ~30,000<u>đ</u>

St Joseph's Cathedral

This historic landmark is known for its striking French Neo-Gothic design and gorgeous interior decor — a throwback to Vietnam's colonial past.

Entrance fee: Free

Opening hours: 8AM – 11AM and 2PM – 5PM (Mon –

Sat); 7AM – 11AM and 3PM – 9PM (Sun)



Slurp up Some Herbal Chicken Noodles at My Ga Tan

Try this insanely popular local dish — tender chicken and springy instant noodles, served in a delicious herbal broth.

Cost: ~40,000₫ – 60,000₫

Opening hours: 10AM – 11PM



Try Local Desserts at Hoa Beo

Indulge yourself with some sweet treats at this dessert stall! The bestseller is hoa qua kem, a simple fruit salad served with ice cream, condensed milk, and shaved ice — a light, refreshing treat at any time of the day. Or try their more unique desserts, like jackfruit caramel or sticky rice yogurt.

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Day 3

Ninh Binh is known as the 'Halong Bay on land' thanks to its vast paddy fields and towering limestone hills. Explore this rustic district on this underrated day trip, just a two-hour drive from Hanoi!

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Stroll Around Ancient Hoa Lu

This timeworn citadel dates back to the 10th century, when Hoa Lu was the capital of Vietnam. Be sure to visit its most popular monuments —two temples dedicated to emperors Dinh Tien Hoang and Dai Hanh.

Entrance Fee: ~20,000₫

Opening hours: 7AM – 5PM




Cycle Around the Tam Coc Countryside


From Hoa Lu, grab a bike at cycle to scenic Tam Coc. You'll enjoy unique sights like rice paddy fields and small villages.

Cost: Varies

Boat Tour Around Halong Bay

Cruise through the famous bay, and see the limestone karsts up close with some kayaking! If you're on a day trip, head straight to the Tuan Chau Jetty, where you'll find boat tours featuring the standard itinerary — a quick hike to Titop Summit, a kayaking activity, and a visit to a limestone cave.

To explore at a more relaxed pace, opt for an all-inclusive overnight cruise.

Entrance fee: ~1,400,000₫

Mount Fansipan

Day 5 - 6

The massive Mount Fansipan stands 3,143 metres above sea level, making it the tallest mountain in Vietnam, Laos, and Cambodia combined!

Get adventurous with a 2D1N hike, or take it easy with a quick cable car ride to the peak.



Ascend Mount Fansipan, the 'Roof of Indochina'

For adventure, exercise, and spectacular views, challenge yourself on an overnight hike! On the first day, it's a seven-hour climb to base camp, where you'll rest for the night. The next morning, leave well before sunrise for the last two-hour stretch to the peak.

If you're pressed for time, another option is to ride a cable car to the top — the entire ascent takes only 15 minutes! After a few hours on the mountain, you can spend the rest of the day exploring Sapa town.


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















Bana Hills

Start by riding the cable car up to the iconic Golden Bridge, shaped like two gigantic hands holding a golden thread. You can stroll through the quaint French Village and romantic gardens, or get your heart racing on the Alpine Coaster. And you can't miss the Fantasy Park — a massive three-storey arcade tucked inside a cave!

Entrance Fee: ~750,000d

Opening hours: 7AM - 10PM







Go Hiking at Bach Ma National Park

Put on some comfy shoes and explore this lush national park. Highlights include Hai Vong Dai, a pavilion with panoramic views, and the Do Quyen Fall, standing 300 metres above sea level.

Entrance Fee: ~60,000₫

Opening hours: 7:30AM – 5PM

OR

Explore the UNESCO World Heritage Site, Paradise Cave

This spectacular cave has karst limestone formations which are said to resemble gnomes and other magical creatures.

Entrance fee: ~250,000₫

Opening hours: 7AM – 4:30PM



Day 10

Round off the trip in Hoi An, with an ancient town lined with quaint cafes, colourful lanterns, and old shophouses in architectural styles from the Chinese, French, Japanese, and Vietnamese. At night, the river lights up with glowing lanterns, like a scene straight out of a Disney movie.



Ride a Basket Boat at the Coconut Village

At this fascinating village, you can try everything from net fishing to buffalo riding, and of course, take a scenic ride on the unique round boats. The fishermen will even whirl you around, if you've got the stomach for it!

Cost: ~30,000₫ for entrance; from ~150,000₫ for a boat ride

Opening hours: Varies; most operators open from

9AM - 5PM



Hop on a bike and explore the ancient alleys of Hoi An. If you're not sure where to start, drop by the White Rose Restaurant, known for its family-secret rice paper dumplings. Then cycle out to the Tra Que Vegetable Village to experience a more peaceful way of life. Keep your eyes out for other surprises along the way!
