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



Hakone offers a lovely change of scenery, with iconic landmarks, sulphuric hot springs, and old-school charm.

How to get to Hakone from Tokyo: Take a train ride from Shinjuku to Odawara Station via the Odakyu Line. From Odawara, transfer to the Hakone Yuzan train and alight at Hakone Yumoto Station. The entire journey takes ~2hrs.

A more convenient, pricier option is an 85min train ride on the Romance Car, direct from Shinjuku to Hakone Yumoto Station.



**How to get there:** At the Nagano Dentsu Station, buy a one-day Snow Monkey Pass, which includes a roundtrip express bus between Nagano Station and the Jigokudani Monkey Park



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
